

High Heavens & Deep Waters Teetotaler Tour, One-Day Tour

Reach to the sky during a church tour highlighted with Tiffany design and a visit to a museum dedicated to an aviation pioneer, and enjoy the waters of the deepest of the Finger Lakes during a narrated cruise!

Visit the First Presbyterian Church of Bath, NY, where you'll see the work of Louis Comfort Tiffany who created the sanctuary's interior design in the 1890s. The building itself was built in 1877 in Venetian Gothic style of native stone, then the interior remodeled by Tiffany 20 years later. It has been said that Tiffany's rich materials and colors and his use of symbolic motif combine to create an effect rarely found in American Protestant churches. Highlights of the architecture include pointed arches framing the windows and doorways which direct the eyes upward to God and a circular window made of the famous Tiffany favrile glass. Its circular shape, repeated throughout the interior, symbolizes eternity, with no beginning and no end.



Discover the beauty and charm of Seneca Lake as it can only be seen from water during a narrated lake cruise. You will be captivated by Hector Falls at 165 feet, the majestic cliffs of the east shore with Native American paintings, and a view of the salt industry that now harvests the lake mineral. The largest of the Finger Lakes and the deepest lake in New York, it is known as the lake trout capitol of the world, and has been used by the Navy to test sonar equipment.



Visit the Glenn Curtiss Museum in Hammondsport to learn about this pioneer in early aviation in the early 1900s. A film tells the tale of Curtiss who began as a bicycle and then motorcycle builder as well as racer becoming in 1907 the "fastest man on earth" when he attained the speed of 136.4 mph on his V8 powered motorcycle. Curtiss was also an aircraft builder and pilot becoming a pioneer in the industry and is credited with developing an early "seaplane." The museum is full of Curtis' motorcycle and planes as well as local collectibles. Visitors are also welcome to visit the Restoration Shop, talk with volunteer craftsmen, and watch them work on historic aircraft when open. This museum truly has something for everyone.
